## Dahle announces assembly bid

Jan. 18, 2012 — One of Lassen County's own has thrown his hat into the race for the state assembly.

Lassen County Dist. 4 Supervisor Brian Dahle announced at Tuesday's board of supervisors' meeting he would not seek another term on the board of supervisors and had decided to for the California First Assembly District seat instead.

"I could not stand idly by and let Sacramento continue down the path of self-destruction," said Dahle.

According to a release from Dahle's campaign, he promises to sponsor a balanced budget amendment, reduce the size of state government and remove state regulations that stifle economic freedom.

"The state of California has placed shackles that have restrained you and your family's ability to prosper. I want to change that and give hope and prosperity to all Californians," Dahle said.

Dahle is a third generation farmer and businessman. He and his wife Megan own and operate Big Valley Seed and Big Valley Nursery in northern Lassen County.

According to the release, Dahle emphasizes his farm heritage, business acumen and county leadership as the solid skill set that make him well suited for this California Assembly district.

He is proud of his record as a four-term county supervisor and a 15-year history of balanced county budgets. "We don't spend more than what we have, and what we do have is paid for here in Lassen County," Dahle said.

He said he's looking forward to the upcoming assembly race, and the opportunity to, "contrast his candidacy against those of his opponents."

In addition, Dahle said if residents have any questions or concerns he can be reached at 251-3888. Lassen County was part of the Third Assembly District and represented by Dan Logue, but the county became part of the First Assembly District after statewide redistricting based upon the 2010 census.
